b)	LAA Paper CL said that his impression of the paper was that some areas were not doing well but many were making some progress DT mentioned areas of contradiction due to the effects of the recession – for example increase in use of gyms – this is because people can no longer afford private gyms so are using public gyms more and the low take up of formal childcare – this is because lots of people are now out of work and don't need childcare! DT spoke about the issue of social cohesion (5.8 page 5) PW said there has been a lot in the press about the Prevent Agenda. There is a 'prevent' sub group which will be looking at social cohesion and how to measure it. Keep saying that people get on together but have no evidence to back this up. AB There has been no reportback on any progress – the Prevent Strategy should have been item at the last Social Cohesion Forum but it didn't happen. AB Social Cohesion indicators in Local H which is monitored through the Place Survey. Camden did not do as well as expected in this also the police are worried about NI21 in which Camden scored badly. Consultation has identified communication as the main cause of concern from residents. NA raised the issue of the NI's around young people which seem to be much lower than last year CL Felt that lots of the figures in the report relate to the early days of
