

Camden Community Empowerment Network Election Process

- 1. Executive Board Members are elected for 18 months.
- 2. Candidates must be from either
 - a. Category A small front line organisations (who work mainly with individuals or
 - b. Category B infrastructure organisations (who work mainly with other organisations)
- 3. Candidates will be eligible if their organisation is a voluntary or community sector organisation (VCS) based in Camden
- 4. Those elected must sign a Code of Conduct and Commitment form that they will attend regular Executive Board meetings and other meetings organised by the CCEN and work within our equal opportunities procedure
- 5. Nomination papers will be sent out to every VCS organisation on the CCEN mailing list, giving 21 days for organisations to discuss who to nominate and then return them
- 6. The nomination papers returned to the CCEN that do not contain all the information requested will be considered spoilt
- 7. One voting paper will be mailed to each VCS organisation on the CCEN mailing list giving 21 days for discussion vote and return
- 8. Voting papers returned by the deadline will be opened, counted and checked by persons appointed by the CCEN
- 9. Nomination papers or voting papers received after the stated deadline will be consider void
- 10. Voting papers and returning officer reports will be stored in the CCEN office and be open to inspection
- 11. A list of successfully elected candidates will be published on the CCEN website and in Voluntary Matters.
- 12. Where an elected member can no longer continue to sit on the Executive Board due to ill health or personal reasons he / she may be replaced by election or co-option as decided by the CCEN Executive Board.
